#### Celebrating Girl Scouts.

In mid-July, I had the opportunity to participate in the 2023 Girl Scout National Convention, which happens every three years. It was an incredible week in Orlando, Florida with 10,000 dedicated and enthusiastic Girl Scouts and the first in-person convention since 2017.

The first portion of the week was the National Council Session (NCS), which was a gathering of delegations from all councils around the country as well as our international sisters. Your GSMISTS delegates and alternates were excellent representatives who devoted many hours over the past nine months to prepare for their service. Seven proposed amendments were submitted for consideration. Three were defeated and four were approved. See the full report on page 3. The NCS was done using our system of governance, with girls playing an active part in the process. It was clear to see the leadership development in action. We can be proud of the tradition of our governance system and the forward thinking of our diverse delegates.

The second portion of the week was called Phenom. It was a vibrant and engaging event for all Girl Scouts interested in attending. There were musical performances, inspirational messages, and incredible activities at booths in the Hall of Experiences, hosted by proud partners like GM, NASA, and Clover. The 10,000+ Girl Scouts in attendance were delighted to meet and greet those from across the country to share swaps, patches, and stories. What was clear was that the Girl Scout experience is one that allows us to be different in our own way while also a part of something bigger and meaningful.

A new GSUSA Board Chair, Noorain Khan, was installed and we were thrilled to cheer her on as a fellow Girl Scout from west Michigan. Noorain is a Gold Award Girl Scout from our council who graduated from Forest Hills Central High School and has fond memories that include the Betsy Cutler House. The Girl Scout experience changed her life, and she shared her commitment to providing that same opportunity to all girls, in all communities.

It was a privilege to represent GSMISTS and an inspiration to see the power of the Girl Scout movement firsthand. Here at council, we look forward to this new membership year and all the girls who will be developing courage, confidence, and character to make the world a better place.

#### 56th National Council Session July 18–20, 2023 Action Taken

Over the last three days, National Council delegates debated seven proposals and took the following actions:

#### Proposal 7–Girl Scouts Gold Award Scholarship Fund

THAT the National Council hereby affirms the recommendation of the Movement Gold Award Scholarship Foundation Task Force to create a donor-restricted fund in support of Gold Award scholarships; and

THAT that in recognition of its importance, the existence of such fund shall be reflected in the Blue Book of Basic Documents in the Fundraising Policies section of the Blue Book (or any successor section of the Blue Book as may be appropriate from time to time).

• This proposal was approved as presented.

#### **Proposal 6–Constitutional Amendment: Timing of Delegate Allotment**

Each local council to which a charter has been issued and remains in force shall be entitled to the following delegates based on the number of girls under its jurisdiction who are members of the Girl Scouts of the United States of America as of September 30, two years of the year preceding the regular session of the National Council:

a. two (2) delegates;b. one (1) additional delegate for up to 3,500 girls;c. one (1) additional delegate for every 3,500 girls thereafter.

• This proposal was approved as presented.

#### Proposal 3—Constitutional Amendment: Council Representation on the National Board

• This proposal was defeated.

#### **Proposal 5–Constitutional Amendment: Formula for Delegates**

• This proposal was defeated.

## Proposal 1—Constitutional Amendment: Allowing the Possibility of Virtual Attendance for National Council Sessions and for Special Sessions of the National Council

- This proposal was divided.
- Sections 1 and 3 were approved as presented.
- Section 4 of the proposal was amended to limit the board's discretion regarding virtual attendance at regular sessions of the National Council to emergency situations. The final wording for proposal 4 is:

Two hundred members of the National Council present in person shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at sessions of the National Council, provided, however, that delegates are present from one or more local councils in a majority of the geographical areas of the country as defined in the Bylaws. At the sole discretion of the National Board, any special National Council session and in the event of an emergency any regular National Council Session may be held in whole or in part by means of the internet or other electronic communications technology pursuant to which the members of the National Council have the opportunity to read or hear the proceedings substantially concurrently with their occurrence, vote on matters submitted to the members, pose questions, and make comments. Attendance through such means shall constitute presence in person at such meeting for quorum and voting purposes. In the absence of a quorum, a majority of those present at the time and place set for a session may take an adjournment from time to time until a quorum shall be present.

#### Proposal 4—Constitutional Amendment: DEIRJ Language Proposal

• This proposal was approved as amended. The final wording of this proposal is:

#### DIVERSITY, PLURALISM AND ANTI-RACISM

Girl Scouts advance diversity, pluralism, and anti-racism and actively identify and oppose racism by removing systemic barriers to participation in our Movement and in the communities in which we live.

#### Proposal 2—Amend the Promise and Law

- This proposal was divided into two sections.
- Both sections were defeated.

## Maker Badges

NEW





The nine new Maker badges— three for Daisies, three for Brownies, and three for Juniors—are inspired by, and expand on, the popular Artist and Craft badges our members know and love. Each level has three badges: Art and Design, Craft and Tinker, and Create and Innovate.

#### **Art and Design**

In the Art and Design badges, Girl Scouts examine different styles and elements of art and design. They explore how art and design can be found everywhere, from paintings on walls to the label and design of a water bottle. Girl Scouts complete projects through mediums of their choice, one of which they share with the troop—or more broadly.

#### **Craft and Tinker**

In the Craft and Tinker badges, Girl Scouts focus on building objects to solve problems. They explore how objects are crafted with different purposes and users in mind. Girl Scouts look into such concepts as form, fit, and function and practice using tools. They then tinker with one of their projects to make it even better.

#### **Create and Innovate**

In the Create and Innovate badges, Girl Scouts explore prototyping, the design thinking process, and how products and objects are created, improved, and even sold. They'll look at user-centered design and making to solve problems for others as they complete a variety of projects, one of which they innovate and share with others.

#### **Animal Observer**

In this NEW badge, Daisies use their senses of sight, hearing, smell, and touch to observe and learn about animals. They'll look at wild and domesticated animals, experiment with camouflage, play animal games, and even learn a little bit about how scientists take field notes.

#### **Animal Habitats**

In this updated badge, Juniors learn about where and how animals live. They'll find out about animal habitats and shelters—and even build their own animal shelter! They'll also learn how and why many animal habitats are endangered and find out what they can do to help.

#### **Animal Helpers**

In this updated badge, Cadettes find out how animals help people—and discover how they can help animals in return. They'll learn about the human-animal connection and how it has changed over millions of years, then read about searchand-rescue animals and emotional and physical support animals. They'll also learn how they can give back by helping the creatures that help us.



Three new patches have been designed for Girl Scouts girls in 4th to 12th grade, to expand on popular mental wellness activities available, to benefit from participating in outdoor activities that provide an opportunity to be active, engage with nature, and boost their mental wellness.

Knowing My Emotions (Juniors), Finding My Voice (Cadettes), and Showing Up For Me and You (Seniors and Ambassadors) are meant to be facilitated in intimate settings with in troops or through council-facilitated events where participants can safely explore their feelings and seek support or resources to enhance their well-being. These programs provide activities around mental wellness, behavioral issues, and healthy habits. They progress as participants grow to teach them age-appropriate, positive approaches to self-care. Remember to utilize GSMISTS <u>Sensitive Issues Permission Form</u> for sensitive conversations.

These patch programs are made possible by HCA Healthcare Foundation and have been developed in collaboration with the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), leaders in the space of mental wellness.

Detailed choice activities, meeting tools, and additional resources and materials can be found within the Volunteer Toolkit (VTK).

It is recommended that volunteers complete the GSUSA The Mental Wellness Patch Program: Why It Matters and How to Implement It gsLearn module before working on the new Mental Health patches with their troop. In this course, volunteers will learn best practices for holding a Mental Wellness Patch Program to give your Girl Scouts the tools and support they need to better understand and care for their mental health. The course is approximately 20 minutes long. The first two parts of the course review mental wellness concepts and provide an overview of the program as a whole. Part three provides specific tracks for each program level. It is highly recommended that you complete the GSUSA Mental Wellness 101 and GSUSA Delivering Inclusive Program courses before starting this one. Doing both offers you a chance to get the most out of the Mental Wellness Patch Program and helps you learn how to promote a healthy environment where Girl Scouts can thrive and grow.

#### **Daisy Bilingual Entrepreneur Program**

Five Daisy Entrepreneurship badges are now available in English and Spanish as a bilingual version. The badges included are Cookie Goal Setter, Money Explorer, My First Cookie Business, My Money Choices, and Toy Business Designer. You can find the badge booklet in the <u>Girl Scout Shop</u>. In addition, the bilingual version of the Daisy Cookie Family Entrepreneur pin activities is now available for free download on <u>gs.org</u>.

#### **GSMISTS Activity/Trip Application Form**

GSMISTS must approve the following activities:

- Day trips lasting over 8 hours (including travel time)
- Any High Risk/High Adventure Activity requiring approval based on <u>Safety Activity</u> <u>Checkpoints</u>

- Any activity involving staying the night somewhere
- Extended travel (3 or more nights)
- International travel

Submit the <u>GSMISTS Activity/Trip Application Form</u> to begin the approval process. More information can be found in <u>GSMISTS Activity and Trip Planning Guide</u>.

#### **Girl Scout Activity Insurance**

Any person participating in any Girl Scout activity or trip must be a registered member of GSMISTS or covered by appropriate Girl Scout activity insurance. A portion of the individual annual Girl Scout registration fee pays for Plan 1 Basic coverage (supplementary activity insurance) for Girl Scout members only.

Additional insurance coverage must be purchased for any approved, supervised Girl Scout activity that:

- involves non-Girl Scouts (Plan 2)
- includes trips lasting three nights or more (Plan 2, Plan 3E, or 3P)
- travel outside the United States (Plan 3PI)

An approved, supervised Girl Scout activity is an activity carried out by girls who are registered members of the Girl Scout Movement under the overall supervision of volunteers, in keeping with GSMISTS <u>Volunteer Policies & Procedures</u>, <u>Volunteer Essentials</u>, and <u>Safety Activity</u> <u>Checkpoints</u>.

Purchase additional insurance at least 4 weeks before insurance is needed.
