Small Craft Safety Training | Greenville

Learn and practice small craft safety! This training permits GS volunteers to facilitate canoeing and kayaking with their Girl Scouts.

Please note, this is a HYBRID training. Completion of this course involves:

- 1. Completing gsLearn video modules (Approximately 30 min in length)
- 2. Passing online exam prior to in-person training (80% or higher) (approximately 30 minutes total test time)
- 3. Successfully completing the in-person training and skills assessment with GSMISTS

Participants must demonstrate: Swimming ability, shore-based rescues, on-water rescues, self-rescues, and supported rescues for other boaters. This training is valid for 2 years after completion.

Meet Our Gold Award Girl Scouts

The Gold Award recognizes the extraordinary and outstanding accomplishments of girls making a difference in their community and looking at the impact their project has on a local, national, or even global scale. The process to become a Gold Award Girl Scout starts with a girl either earning the Girl Scout Silver Award and completing one Girl Scout Senior or Ambassador journey or completing two Senior or Ambassador journeys. Next, the girl identifies a need or concern she is passionate about. Then she develops a Take Action Project that addresses the underlying cause of the need or concern.



Caydence Pawloski | Musical Sensory Garden

Noticing very few school playgrounds provide children with disabilities places to go that stimulate their senses or offer a relaxing place to be, Caydence wanted her Gold Award Project to address this gap in resources for her local community. Sensory and musical sensory gardens add to the development and senses of children so she set out to research, plan, and implement a sensory garden for the over 300 students with special education needs at Lowell Public Schools. Caydence worked to educate school staff, parents, and community members on this great addition to the school and identify the positive impact these gardens can provide students.



Molly Potts | Load 'Em Up With Ease

In handling animals at the Berlin Fair, Molly noticed the setup left room for improvement concerning the safety of the handlers and the animals. Molly identified that a chute would allow for a more effective way to move large numbers of animals. With a chute available, theanimals are less stressed during transport making it saferfor the animals and the handlers as well. She worked to raise the funds to purchase a loading chute – a piece of farming equipment that costs over \$6,000.00. She provided education and demonstrations to Berlin Fair Board Members, volunteers, and spectators.



Makayla Socall | Shedding a Light on Healthy Eating Through Gardening

Identifying the increasing rate of adverse health impact, Makayla worked to incorporate more education and activities around nutrition. She provided an educational component in her education series and got second grade students at her elementary school involved in understanding healthy eating habits as well as planting and growing vegetables. Second graders at the school grew their own lettuce as an exercise to put their knowledge to use.



Jocelyn Tolliver | Addressing (dis) ABILITY

Observing the importance of inclusion of everyone in her community, Jocelyn noticed there were opportunities for her to make a positive impact to improve education about adults and children who are disabled in the Grand Haven area. She coordinated a community event at a local playground, the Imagination Station, to provide education about adults and children that have a disability and how community members can better support them. Jocelyn worked to get the Imagination Station added to the barrier free park list to help notify community members and tourists of this great recreation area for all to enjoy.



Emma Wahlberg | Wetland Fringe Enhancement Project

Rain gardens are one way that Emma saw to improve water pollution; a cause she champions to ensure this natural resource in our Michigan communities is protected. She worked hard to identify a leading cause of the water pollution, research resolutions, empower others through education and communication. Emma demonstrated what it takes to create the rain garden, the benefits of the gardens, as well as a how-to guide others to build their own.
