Designed to receive the Twilight Trek Patch, Girl Scout Juniors and Cadettes (Grades 4th-8th) spend the night at Camp Anna Behrens in Greenville or Camp Woodlands in Alpena experiencing the outdoors with night hikes, star gazing, and other camp activities.

Camporee | Jun. 2025

Girl Scout Daisies-Juniors (Grades K-5th) are invited to participate in a day of archery, outdoor skills, and crafts!



Mackinac Island Day Trip | Jul. 2025

A day trip designed to introduce the Mackinac Island Scout Service Program. Participants will meet current members of Girl Scout Honor Troop 147, who serve the state of Michigan by taking on tasks including flag ceremonies, guide duties, and service projects on Mackinac Island.



Schoolship with Inland Seas | Jul. 2025

Girl Scout Juniors-Ambassadors (Grades 4th-12th) will act as scientists and stewards conducting a series of tests on macroinvertebrate biodiversity, riparian zone quality, water chemistry, and stream characteristics in a local watershed to determine its health.



Community Camp Weekend | Aug. 2025

Girl Scout Troops spend a weekend together at Camp Anna Behrens enjoying the great outdoors and celebrating sisterhood as they cook their own food and create activities for other troops to participate in.



Me and My Gal Overnight | Sept. 2025

A weekend event for Girl Scouts to bring their favorite Gal: Mom, Aunt, Grandma, etc. for a weekend of camping, archery, canoeing, and Girl Scout traditions.



Girl Scouts Love State Parks | Sept. 2025

Head out to explore local state parks during this year's Girls Scouts Love State Parks Weekend! On September 13th and 14th, Girl Scouts can participate in self-guided tours, family hikes, watersports, stargazing, and more to earn a patch.

A booklet curated for Girl Scout Cadettes-Ambassadors (Grades 6th-12th), this guide details opportunities available for our older girls and is mailed to all Cadette, Senior and Ambassador Troop Leaders.

Youth Mental Health First Aid Training

Youth Mental Health First Aid training is designed to teach volunteers how to help adolescent Girl Scouts who may be experiencing mental health challenges. The course reviews common mental health challenges for today's girls, typical adolescent development, and teaches a 5-step action plan for how to help in both crisis and non-crisis situations.



OWLS Adult Resource Weekends

Held at the Betsy Cutler House in the fall and Camp Anna Behrens in the spring, OWLS Adult Resource Weekends allows for adult volunteers to gather together, meet other Girl Scout volunteers, and participate in trainings that further enhance their leadership skills.



Archery Training

Proper archery training is essential for both safety and skill development. This course available during the OWLS Adult Resource weekends ensures volunteers learn the correct techniques and safety requirements needed for archery related Girl Scout programs.



Wilderness First Aid Training

A training course designed to teach GSMISTS volunteers how to handle emergencies and provide medical care in remote or wilderness settings. Topics covered include assessing injuries, managing environmental factors and improvising medical treatments with limited resources.



First Aid and CPR Training

Girl Scout troops need an adult who is trained in First Aid and CPR in order to participate in many different activites including overnight trips and high risk activities like horseback riding, archery, climbing/high ropes courses, and skiing.



Small Craft Training

Hosted by GSMISTS training staff at Camp Anna Behrens, this training teaches adults how to safely lead the troop in small crafts, including canoes and kayaks.



Troop Camping Skills Training

A required training dedicated to building campfires and cookie in the great outdoors.





Primitive Camping Skills Training

For primitive camping experiences without running water and bathrooms, this training details how to enjoy the great outdoors even with limited resources.



Lifeguard Training

Hosted by GSMISTS training staff, Lifegaurd training teaches volunteers how to prevent, recognize, and respond to emergencies in and around water.



Criminal Background Checks

Girl Scouts of Michigan Shore to Shore is committed to providing a safe, inclusive, all-girl environment where girls build courage, confidence, and character. When applying to be a volunteer that involves direct contact with girls or handling money, a criminal background check is required.



Manikins and AED Trainers

To give a realistic training on delivering correct treatment including CPR and shock delivery, GSMISTS training staff is in need of a set of four manikins and AED trainers.





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
